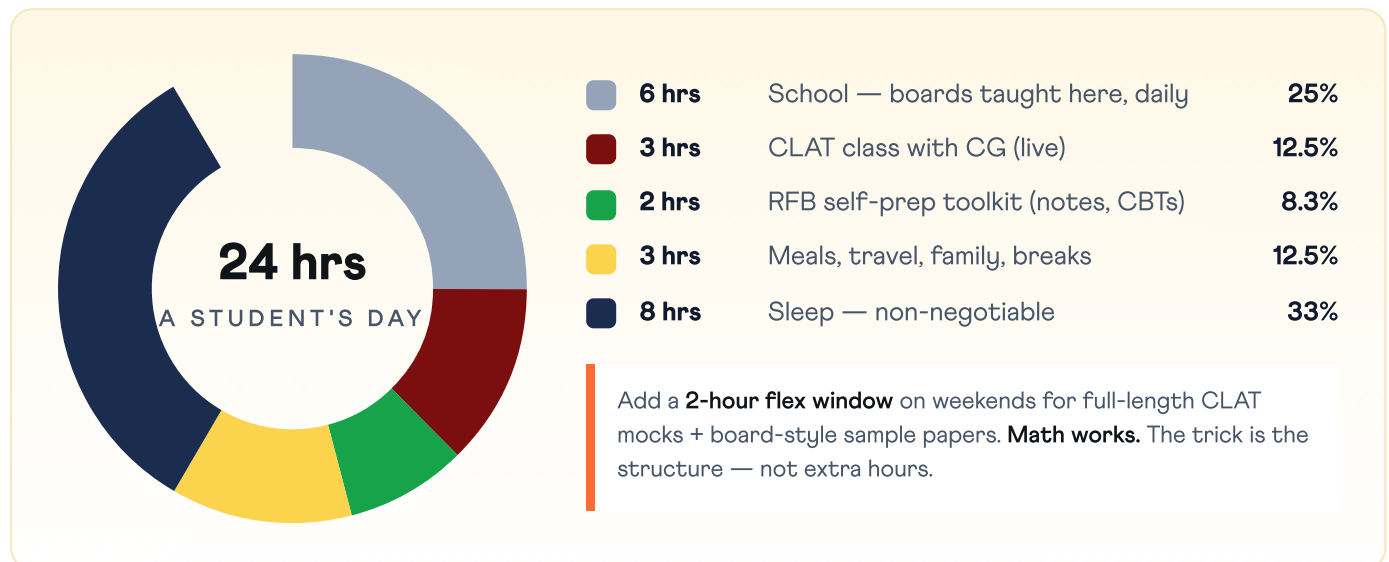

SECTION 9

Restitution of Conjugal Rights

"Where either spouse has, without reasonable excuse, withdrawn from the society of the other, the aggrieved party may petition the court for restitution of conjugal rights — an order that the parties resume living together."

01
The Trigger

One spouse withdraws from the society of the other — physically leaves the matrimonial relationship.

02
The Test

The withdrawal must be WITHOUT reasonable excuse. A good reason (cruelty, another valid marriage) defeats the petition.

03
Burden Shifts

Once withdrawal is proved, the burden of showing reasonable excuse lies on the spouse who withdrew.
