ENGLISH LANGUAGE & LOGICAL REASONING

1. Correct Answer: A

Explanation: The journalist's tone is neutral and reportorial — balancing cultural history, political statements, and legal developments.

2. Correct Answer: B

Explanation: The idiom "only in books" conveys legal existence without practical effect — symbolic compliance.

3. Correct Answer: A

Explanation: The paradox lies in *continued illegality coexisting with covert practice*, showing conflict between law and tradition.

4. Correct Answer: B

Explanation: Legislators defend dhirio as "not cruel" and "like boxing," showing *justification* under the guise of cultural defence.

Legal Reasoning

11. Correct Answer: D

The phrase "as soon as possible" imposes a duty of timely action. Indefinite withholding constitutes constitutional impropriety and breaches legislative supremacy.

12. Correct Answer: B

Explanation: Article 200 explicitly provides that after reconsideration, if the Legislature passes the Bill again—with or without amendments—the Governor **must grant assent**. Judicial precedents prohibit repeated returns.

13. Correct Answer: A

Explanation: Article 200's "as soon as possible" phrase compels reasonable promptness. Courts have held that indefinite delays erode democratic accountability and amount to a constitutional wrong.

14. Correct Answer: C

Explanation: The Governor's referral to the President must be based on specific constitutional grounds, primarily where the Bill affects the High Court's powers or raises significant constitutional questions. Political or economic justifications alone are insufficient.

15. Correct Answer: D

Explanation: The Governor's silence beyond a reasonable time is unconstitutional. Article 200 allows only three options assent, return, or reserve. Pocket veto is inconsistent with constitutional accountability and violates legislative sovereignty.

16. Correct Answer: B

Explanation: After reconsideration, the Governor's only option is to assent. The second referral undermines legislative supremacy and violates Nabam Rebia principles.

17. Correct Answer: A

Explanation: As per constitutional convention and judicial interpretation, the Governor must exercise functions based on the Council of Ministers' advice. Reservation without such consultation is unconstitutional.

18. Correct Answer: C

Explanation: "As soon as possible" creates a mandatory duty of timely action. Courts interpret it as requiring reasonable promptness, not indefinite delay. Judicial review ensures accountability.

19. Correct Answer: D

Explanation: Once the Bill is re-passed, the Governor's role becomes ministerial. Multiple returns breach constitutional design and obstruct legislative function, violating cooperative federalism.
