How to sit the mock.

Everything from installing the app to reading your report — in the order you will actually need it.

TIME	2:00 pm – 4:00 pm · 120 questions · 2 hours

YOUR REPORT	Tuesday 8 September

Free. No card, no payment details, no unlock fee.

1 • Before the day

Two minutes of setup now saves you the only thing you cannot get back on the day — time on the clock.

The one rule that matters: sign in with the **same mobile number you registered with**. That number is how your paper, your rank and your report find you. A different number means a different student as far as the system is concerned.

Which device are you on?

Android phone	You sit the paper in the CLAT Gurukul app . Install it now, not on the day — see section 2.
iPhone or iPad	You sit the paper in your browser at app.clatgurukul.com . Nothing to install — see section 3.
Laptop / desktop	Your browser works too. Use Chrome, and plug in if the battery is low.
At a centre	Prefer paper? Walk into any of our six centres on the day and sit it on a real OMR sheet — see section 4.

Check these the night before

1. You can sign in — open the app or app.clatgurukul.com and log in once, today.
2. Your phone is charged, and you have a charger near you.
3. You have two hours where nobody will need you.
4. Paper and pen beside you. You are allowed rough work; you will want it for Quant.

2 . If you are on Android

The app keeps your answers if the network drops, and your full analysis lands in the same place afterwards. This is the route we recommend.

1. **Install the app.** Search **CLAT Gurukul** on the Play Store, or go to **play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.readyforexam.clat**.
2. **Sign in with your registered number.** You will get a 6-digit OTP on WhatsApp.
3. **Open “Mock Tests”** from the home screen.
4. The All-India Open Mock **appears there when the paper opens**, at 2:00 pm on Sunday 6 September 2026. It is not visible before that — that is deliberate, so nobody sees the paper early.
5. Tap it and begin. The timer starts when the paper opens, not when you tap.

We will also WhatsApp you a direct link when the paper opens. Tapping it on an Android phone takes you to the app.

3 . If you are on an iPhone

Exactly the same paper and exactly the same test interface — it runs in Safari instead of an app.

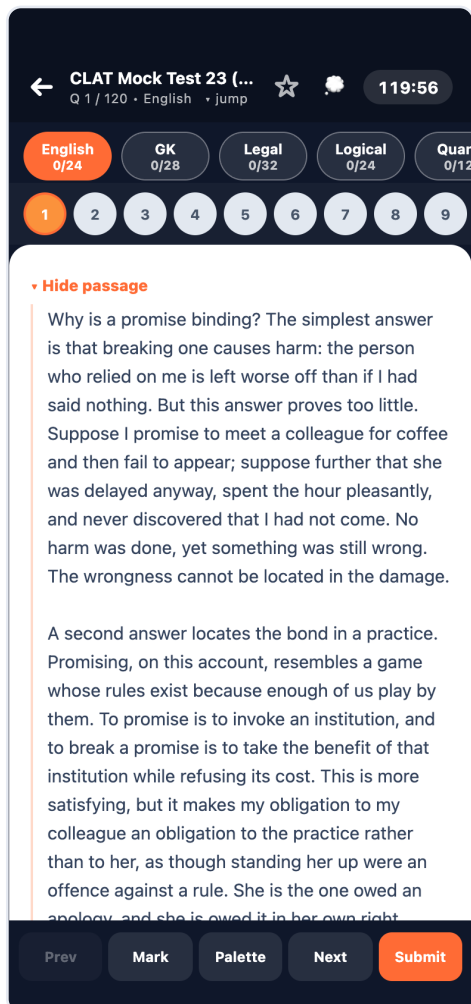
1. Open **app.clatgurukul.com** in Safari.
2. **Sign in with your registered number.** A 6-digit OTP arrives on WhatsApp.
3. Tap **Share** → **Add to Home Screen**. It then opens like an app, and keeps you signed in for 15 days.
4. Open **Mock Tests**. The paper appears when it opens.
5. Or simply tap the link we WhatsApp you when the paper opens — it goes straight there.

4 . Or sit it on paper, at a centre

An invigilator, a hall, a real OMR sheet and a clock on the wall. It is the closest rehearsal there is. Walk in on Sunday 6 September 2026 at any of the six — Ashiana-Digha, Bailey Road, Rajeev Nagar, Danapur, Saguna More (all Patna) or Sikar. Arrive by 1:30 pm. Bring a black or blue ball pen. Your OMR is evaluated the same evening and your report reaches you with everyone else's.

5 . During the paper

120 questions, 120 minutes, five sections. +1 for a correct answer, −0.25 for a wrong one. Nothing for a blank.



What you are looking at

Top bar	Question number, section, and your remaining time.
Section tabs	English, GK, Legal, Logical, Quant. Move between them freely — nothing is locked.
Question strip	Swipe it to jump to any question.
Passage	Scrolls with the question. Tap Hide passage once and it stays hidden for the rest of the paper.
Mark	Flags a question to come back to.
Palette	The whole paper at a glance — answered, marked, untouched.

Three things worth knowing

1. **Your answers save as you go.** If the app closes or the network drops, reopen it — your paper is where you left it, with the clock still correct.
2. **The clock is the paper's, not yours.** It runs from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Starting late does not buy you extra minutes.
3. **Submit when you are done**, or let the clock submit for you. Both are fine; neither is penalised.

A blank is worth 0 and a wrong answer costs 0.25. On a question you can narrow to two options, answering is still the better bet. On one you cannot narrow at all, it is not.

6 . When your result arrives

Tuesday 8 September. You get a WhatsApp when it is ready; the report itself lives in the app and the web app, under **My Results**.

Same evening

Centre OMR sheets are scanned and evaluated.

**Tuesday 8
September**

Scores, all-India rank and your full analysis are published together — online and centre students in one merged rank list.

The day after

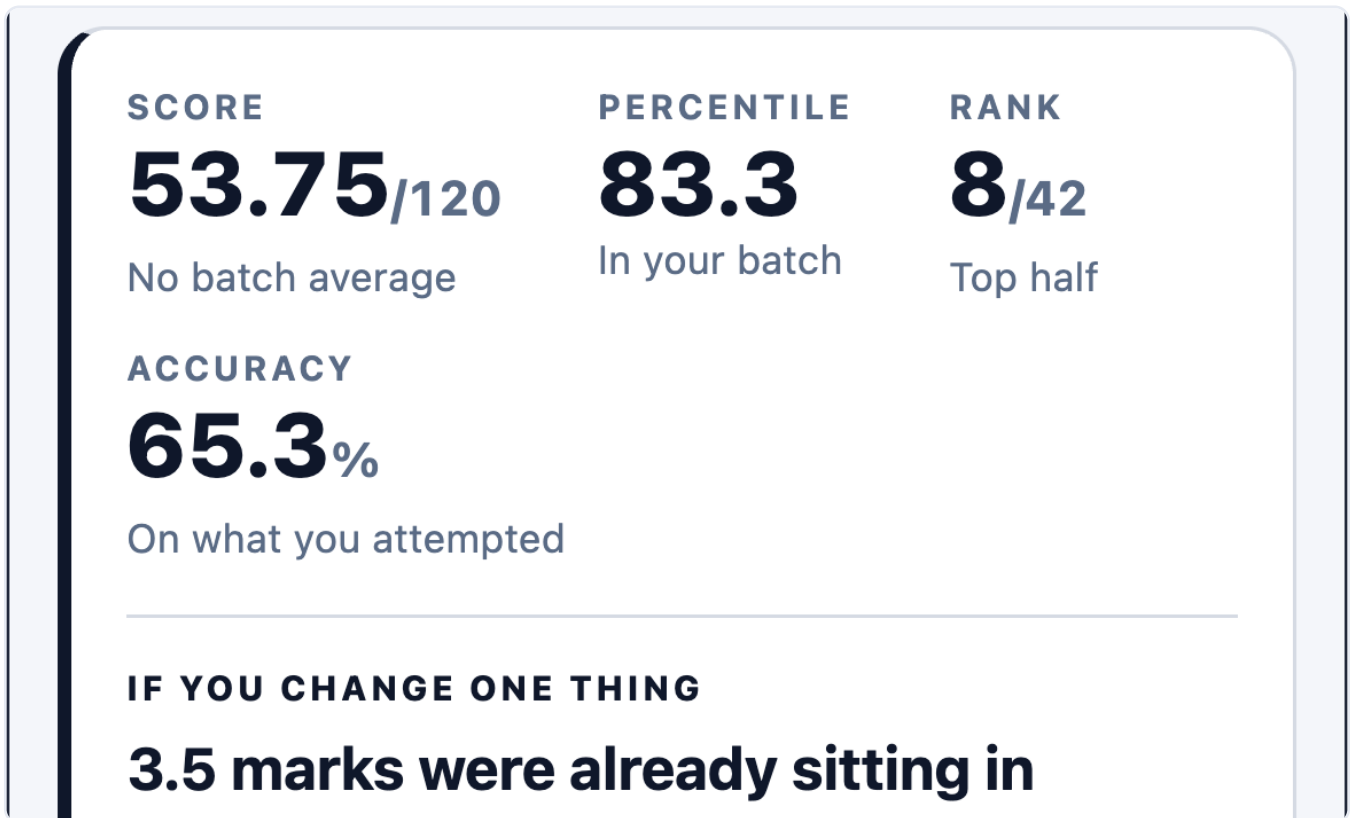
Detailed solutions to every question.

Your rank is computed against everyone who sat this paper on this afternoon, in your own target year — not against last year's cohort, and not against a national estimate.

7 . How to read your report

This is the part most students skip and it is the part that moves marks. Work through it in this order.

Start with the scorecard — but do not stop there



Score, percentile, all-India rank and accuracy — plus the marks that were already sitting in the questions you left blank.

Accuracy is the number to look at first. High accuracy with a low score means you left marks on the table. Low accuracy with a high attempt count means you were guessing.

Then: where the marks actually went

Where the marks went

Attempted 95 of 120 at 65.3% accuracy, 25 left blank. Negative marking cost 8.25.

Negative marking cost you **8.25** marks.

Six categories, not one score.

Careless is not the same as **genuinely hard**, and **skipped** is not the same as **wrong**. Each needs a different fix: careless is a slow-down problem, hard is a syllabus problem, skipped is a strategy problem. Fix the biggest bar first.

Ranked by marks lost, not by how often you got them wrong — a concept you meet twice and miss twice costs less than one you meet nine times and miss five. Measured across every mock you have sat.

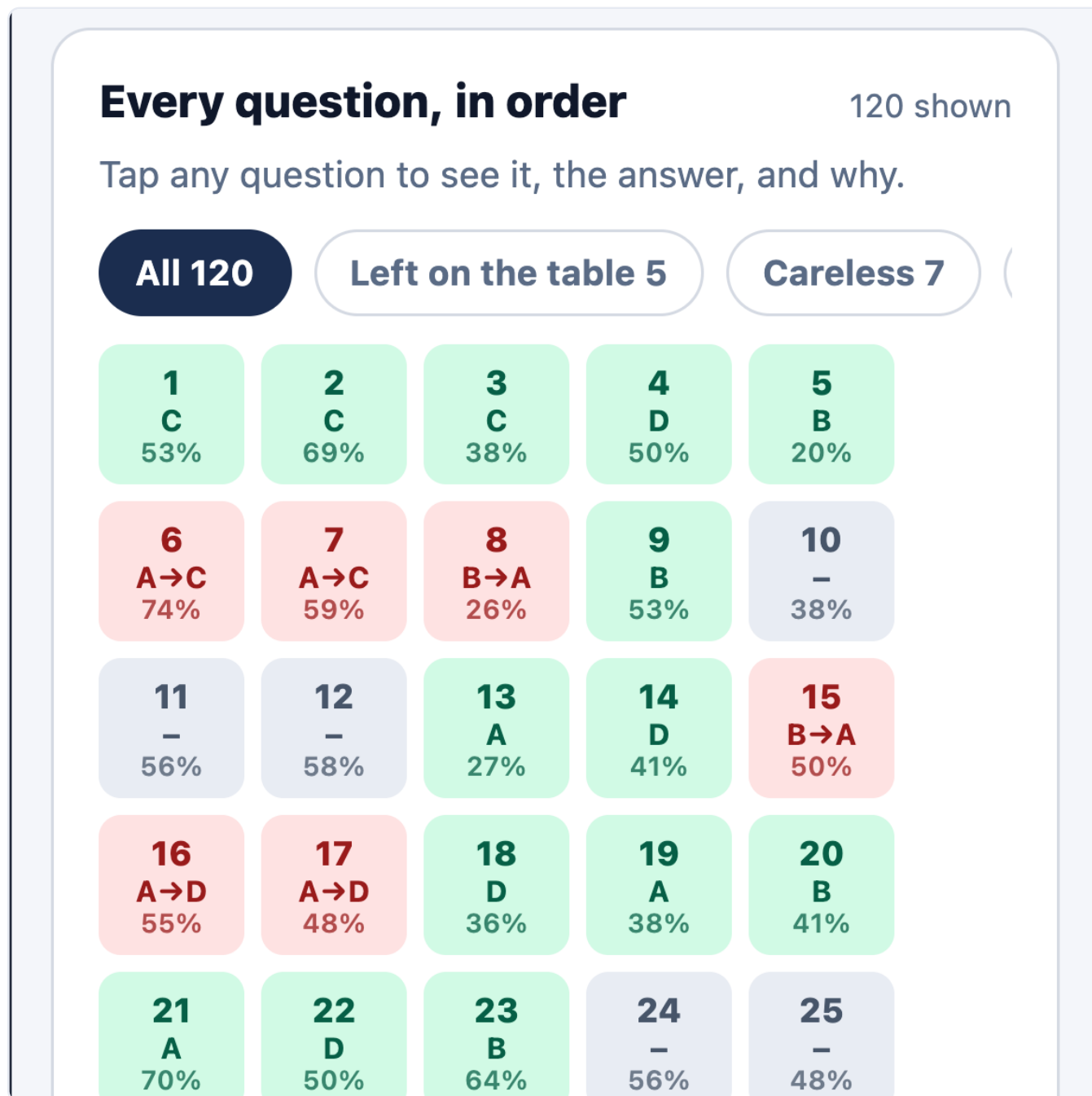
Tap a concept to filter the question grid below to it.

► Show as a table

Ranked by marks lost, not by how often you got them wrong.

A concept you meet twice and miss twice costs you less than one you meet nine times and miss five. This list is already sorted by what it is actually costing you — work down it from the top, not by what feels weakest.

Finally: every question, in order



What you answered, what was right, and what percentage of the batch got it.

The batch percentage is the useful column. A question you missed that **most of the batch got right** is a question you should have had — that is where your next ten marks are. A question almost nobody got is not worth your Monday.
